Note: We continue to support our community by participating in employee health fairs, providing speakers and attending events in as many areas as possible. The general public seems to show a low interest in stroke risks and warning signs unless they, themselves, have experienced a stroke or have a family member or friend who has experienced stroke. We are educating thousands of people each year in hopes that our information will “stick” and they will be prepared if stroke occurs in their family or in their lives. Our dilemma is the same each year – but we continue to engage the community in stroke education. The good news is that stroke has gone DOWN to the fifth leading cause of death, so we are saving lives! But it remains the number one cause of disability.
