In Jenny's words...." I had my stroke January 17, 2015. I was living a pretty typical life up until that point. Three busy kids, sports, busy full time job, etc. Then life seemed to come to a halt. I wasn't used to being the patient and I found myself fighting for my life. On that Saturday I got into the shower like normal, but had to be carried out. I was unable to move my right side or speak. I was taken by EMS to the hospital where I got TPA and Thrombectomy for a clot in the Basilar, or main artery that supplies the brain stem. I was not breathing well and had to be intubated or have a breathing tube placed before surgery. After surgery I could breathe on my own but couldn't talk, swallow or move my right side. I spent several weeks in inpatient rehab relearning all basic functions. I had a feeding tube and could only take a few steps at discharge with the assistance of a therapist and a quad cane. Fast forward to present day. After 4 years of continual therapy I am walking without the cane aided by either an electrical stimulation brace or traditional bracing. I still have very limited use of right hand." Jenny has come a long way and we are so happy to have her with us!
